





The subway system is over 110 kilometers long. Traveling by subway is like traveling through an exciting story that extends from the artistic pioneers of the




1950s to the art experiments of today.

mosaics, paintings, installations, sculptures and more. You can cover the entire Stockholm subway art tour itinerary in just two hours.


