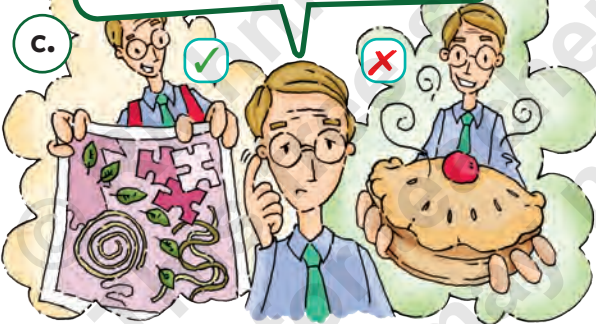

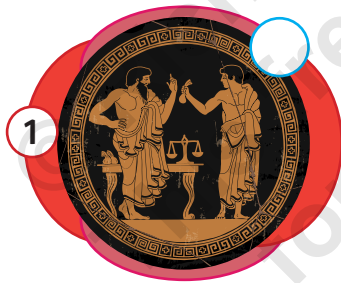
The Vanishing Point

Perspective in art creates the feeling that a painting is three-dimensional even though it is on a flat two-dimensional surface.

The vanishing point is the point on the horizon where the parallel lines converge. It gives paintings a three-dimensional look.

In the Medieval Period, Filippo Brunelleschi invented perspective in art. Before that, the paintings appeared flat.
